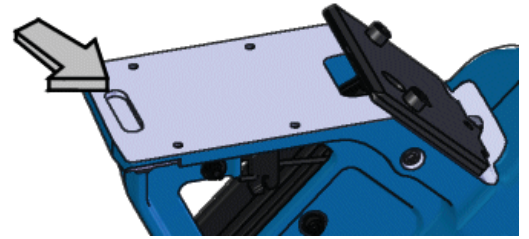




CLICK-ON PLASTIC BASE

This replacement plastic base is installed onto the tool simply with a Click-on action and does not require the use of screws.

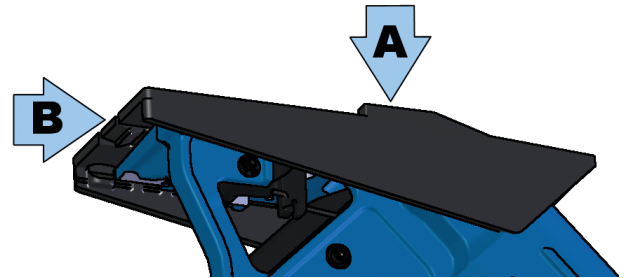
The Click-on action can only be performed on recent tools, which have a pocket into the bottom of the main body as shown on this figure. For older tools, refer to the section '*Conventional Installation*' below.



CLICK-ON Installation

This procedure can only be used on recent tools, having a pocket machined into the main body as shown on the figure above. Do not perform this procedure if your tool does not have this feature; refer to the section '*Conventional Installation*' below.

- Remove the old plastic base and discard the screws.
- Lay your tool upside-down and place the new plastic base as illustrated, the two side tabs not engaged (the base will extend out by about 3/4").
- With your hand, apply moderate pressure (A).
- Firmly hit the end of the base (B) with your hand or the rubber end of the mallet.
- Make sure that the plastic base is completely in place and that the lock tab is fully engaged.
- Do not use screws.



Conventional installation

This installation procedure shall be used only for tools not having a machined pocket into the bottom of the main body as illustrated above. This replacement plastic base can be installed on older tools with 4 screws (supplied) by following these instructions:

- Using a chisel, remove the two side tabs.
- Using a chisel, remove the lock tab
- Install the plastic base and secure in place with the 4 screws.
